Cruel and unusual: Talmudic (de-)construction of the death penalty

Skirball Center for Adult Jewish
Learning at Temple Emanu-El...

The Torah commands the death
penalty for numerous transgressions
and crimes, but many of the Rabbis

felt that this institution should itself be put to rest. We will study Chapter
6 of the Tractate *Sanhedrin*, in which the Talmud discusses the complex rit-
ual of legal murder, including the discussion of the execution of one famous
rabbi from Nazareth, in a portion of Talmud that has been censored for cen-
turies. See how the Rabbis constructed and deconstructed this punishment.
Ponder the uses of discipline and punishment in society, then and today.

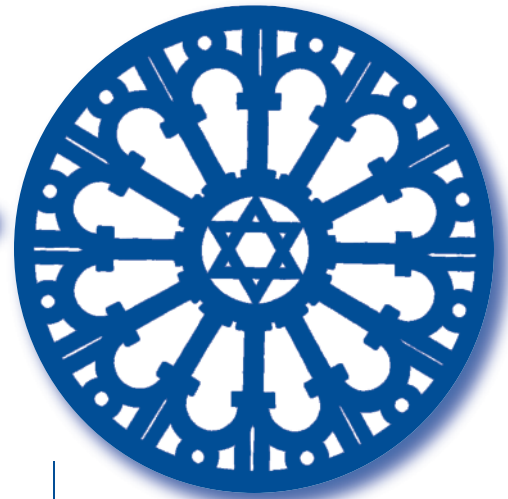
