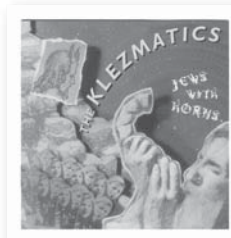

Born in Salisbury, England, Mr. Rutherford used his home town as the setting for *Sarum*, his first work of historical fiction, published in 1987. An immensely popular book, *Sarum* remained on the *New York Times* bestseller list for 23 weeks. Worldwide sales have exceeded 6 million copies published in 15 languages.

Other works include *Russka* (1991); *London*, (1996); *The Forest*, (2000); and his latest book, *Princes of Ireland*, (2004). He currently is working on *Princes of Ireland, Volume 2*.
